For some, the volatility of the year-end leads to an assortment of risky behaviors – inattentive driving, too-much focus on getting in-and-out of stores without paying attention to surroundings, forgetting to implement the most basic of personal safety measures, etc.

# Before heading to the stores

### On the road

- Be aware of other drivers' actions; many of them are feeling stressed as well so their inattentiveness may increase
- In severe weather conditions, it's a good idea to reduce your speed and increase the distance between you and other cars and pedestrians

## Parking lot safety

- · Park as close as you can to the front of the store
- · Park in a well-lit location
- Be sure to lock your car and take your keys with you (yes, plenty of people still forget to do this)
- Make a mental note of where you are parked so that you don't end up wandering the lot after you're done shopping
- Before heading back out to the parking lot, get your keys out and ready don't fumble to find them in the parking lot (especially in inclement weather)

- Keep all valuables (including your new purchases) out of sight; no need to tempt would-be thieves

### While shopping

- Keep your wallet with you at all times, never leave it unattended
- When finalizing a purchase with a debit card at the register, be alert for "wandering eyes" that could be trying to get a
  peek at your PIN code
- Be sure keep track of all your purchased items, unattended bags are a tempting prize an opportunistic thief
- Don't overload yourself with too many bags, periodically store them in the trunk of your car to avoid becoming a possible victim of a purse or bag snatcher
